letter from the director

Dear Residents:

We hope that you and your family had a safe and happy holiday season. We are looking with hope to the road ahead, for our public library, community and wider world beyond in this New Year. While the pandemic shutdown and subsequent tentative work of reopening has brought much strife and struggle, it has not been without victories and clear examples of our community's generosity, resilience and courage. For our part, we are proud of the work our staff has done to safely reopen Wadsworth Public Library. And while visits to our facility in the pandemic months of 2020 are less than 40% of those in comparable months of 2019, circulation of physical library materials remains strong at 80% compared to 2019. At this time, the Library building remains open to the public during our regular, pre-pandemic operating hours (see page 5 of this publication).

If you haven't visited since the start of the pandemic and are eager to return, please visit **www.wadsworthlibrary.com/about-us** to familiarize yourself with our safety protocols and requirements before visiting. With your help and the continued diligent efforts of our staff, we can work together to safely keep the Library's doors open for our community.

While we look forward to the eventual return of in-person programming, seating for casual reading and study, and public access to our meeting rooms, our team has worked hard to maintain continuity of access to core library services under health and safety restrictions. We continue to acquire new books, movies, music, and digital content, and each week, new programs are posted by our public services staff for patrons of all ages and can be viewed on our YouTube channel at **www.wadsworthlibrary.com/live**. Until further notice, late fees for overdue items have been suspended, effectively rendering the Library fine-free. For those unable to physically enter our facility, we are offering both traditional drive-up window service and free home delivery to anyone living within the boundaries of the Wadsworth City School District. We also worked with the City of Wadsworth and the Bird Park Community Garden Committee to launch a successful community garden at Wadsworth's Bird Park, located at 560 Bird Street (see page 7 for details).

While we are proud of these accomplishments, which grew out of experimentation during the initial weeks and months of the pandemic, we are eager to restore suspended aspects of our service just as soon as we can do so safely. In this vein, we need your help. This winter, we are conducting a community survey, which can be found on the next page of this publication, or by visiting **www.wadsworthlibrary.com/survey**. Please take a moment to help us better understand the issues and concerns you have about the reopening of Wadsworth Public Library.

the library is open!

Wadsworth Public Library reopened the end of June 2020, restoring our normal operating hours. It is our goal to keep our doors safely open through the duration of the pandemic. However, we recognize that conditions could change, even by the time this publication reaches your home. We ask for your help in achieving this goal by following the guidelines listed below. We welcome you back and look forward to seeing you soon.

Operating Hours

Monday–Thursday: 9am–9pm

Friday–Saturday: 9am–6pm

Sunday: 1–5pm

Current Guidelines and Limitations*

Masks are required for all patrons 2 years of age and older. Disposable masks are available at service desks.

Service is available for patrons with medical exemptions at the drive-up window or through home delivery.

Practice social distancing at all times, maintaining at least 6 feet of distance from other patrons and staff members.

Visits will be limited to one hour for browsing, checkout, reference, and computer use only.

A limited number of public access computers are available by reservation only in the periodical area. Two express computer stations have been added behind the reference desk; these are available on a first come, first serve basis.

Public meeting rooms, study rooms, and the early literacy play area are unavailable until further notice.

Returned items will be checked in after a quarantine period of 5–7 days. This will not affect borrowing limits, and no late fees will accrue.

Previous fines were cleared on March 16, 2020, and we will remain fine-free until further notice.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I RETURN A BOOK?

Our return and check-in process looks a little different now due to COVID-19. Here's what to expect:

1. Items can be returned **contact-free** in the bin located next to the front desk, the drive-up book drop in the west parking lot, or the book drop next to the front entrance.
2. All returned library items will be placed into a **5-to-7-day quarantine**, as recommended by the Ohio Library Council.
3. Items will be **checked in after the quarantine period**. That means you'll still see the book on your account after dropping it off, but don't worry—check back after a week and your account should be cleared. We are currently fine-free, so **no late fees will accrue** if the due date passes during this time.

home delivery

During restrictions related to COVID-19, we are temporarily offering home delivery for patrons living within the Wadsworth City School District only. It's as easy as 1-2-3!

Step One: Request Your Items

Choose one of the following 3 options for placing your holds:

Call us 330.334.5761 and reference staff will place items on hold for you or help you to find the books, movies, music or other items you're looking for. Let staff know that you would like to have your items delivered.

Email us at reference@wadsworthlibrary.com with your item requests. Let us know your name, the last four digits of your library card number, and that you are requesting home delivery.

Log on to our online catalog to browse and place items on hold. Simply select Home Delivery as the pick-up location.



Step Two: We Call You

When your holds are ready, we'll give you a call using the most current number on file with your library card. If you need to update this information, please let us know when you call or email to make your requests.

Step Three: Your Items are Delivered

Items will be delivered by a member of our Outreach team 3-5 days after being placed on hold. By the time you've received a phone call, your holds have already been checked out for an extended loan period of one month, fine-free. Staff will deliver items right to your door, no contact required.

To return your items, you can drop them off in one of our book drops or have them picked up by staff upon your next delivery.




