Tips for Reading Alovd

- ightarrow Read slowly and with lots of expression, even try on a few new voices
- Before you read, make predictions, look at the cover, read the title—what will happen in the story?
- \overleftrightarrow While reading, make connections to what is happening in the story to your own world
- \overleftrightarrow Allow them to help you turn the pages
- \overleftrightarrow Point out the words as you read to help them connect the word spoken aloud to the word in print
- \bigwedge Point out things in the illustrations, enjoy the artwork
- \bigwedge After reading, let your child ask questions and take time to answer them or search for the answers together
- Create a reading routine, making sure to take time everyday to read aloud to your child


