Story/ Book/ Folktale (People of all ages benefit from hearing stories read aloud. For older adults it can be a chance to stir memories and use their imagination)

GREECE FACTS:

- Greece is located in southern Europe.
- Greece is located in the Mediterranean Sea. The Greek coastline borders the Ionian Sea and the Aegean Sea as well as the Libyan and Crete Seas in the south.
- The country consists of the mainland with two peninsulas Peloponnese (in the southwest) and Chalkidiki (in the northeast).
- Greece also includes an archipelago of about 6,000 islands with Crete being the largest island.
- Greece is slightly smaller in size than the state of Alabama.
- The capital of Greece is Athens. Athens is known as the oldest capital city in Europe. Athens is named after Athena, the Greek goddess of wisdom.
- Greece does still have a royal family. However, King Constantine II does not have any power in governing the country as the monarchy was abolished in Greece in 1974. The royal family includes King Constantine II, born in 1940, Queen Anne-Marie, their five children and nine grandchildren. Constantine II is also the younger brother of Queen Sofia of Spain.
- The Greek Flag has nine horizontal stripes, four white and five blue.
 The stripes represent the nine syllables in the greek words for "freedom or death". In the upper left corner is a white cross on a blue background which represents the Orthodox Church.







